Dear Members

It's been a great season for fruit this year so no doubt plenty of jam has been made and boxes of fruit put in the freezer as well as much of it already consumed. However on a lot of plots there is soft fruit not picked, windfalls left to rot and fruit left on the trees. If you don't want the fruit perhaps you could let other plotholders harvest it rather than let it go to waste.

There was the usual flurry of activity before the plot inspection so we only had to leave a few 'action needed' notices and hopefully people will do what is required without the need for a warning letter.

Fruit bushes overhanging pathways are still causing a problem. If you don't cut them back and they are obstructing the path they may well be cut by the Thursday Volunteers and the branches left for you to dispose of.

Unfortunately we haven't been able to make any progress with our planning application to rebuild the hut and toilet. At the moment we have put a suggestion to the planner to screen the containers with a stone wall rather than replace the containers with a brick or stone building and we are waiting for his reply. Once we have any positive news we will let you know.

Don't forget about your plot now that autumn is here because even if you haven't any over wintering crops the grass and the weeds will still grow and need dealing with from time to time between now and the spring.

Manure

It is hedge cutting time again, we started on the wild harvest hedge a few weeks ago, and it is filling out very well and already producing elderberries and rose hips. We intend to keep it at fence height, hopefully it will thicken out lower down.

Cutting has progressed well on the eastern boundary and this year we will be able to deal with all the trimmings because we have recently purchased a petrol shredder. You may notice that the willow has been left. Leeds Coppice Workers will cut it down and re-use it for their school projects, this should happen in November

Karin and Steve Wilde did the demonstration starter bed this year and it was very productive.

The burned trees are to be inspected and hopefully work will be done on them.

All the wildflower areas looked lovely this year, we have been working hard to tidy them and put them to bed for the winter in the hope that they will be even better next year.

Any new additions to our happy band will be made most welcome.

Allotment Shop

The shop now has some new lines, including Autumn/Winter lines such as autumn lawn feed, bird seed, composted manure, ground cover sheeting and holding pegs.



Strulch is an organic composted straw weed suppressant and mulch. We have had several requests for this. The good news is that we'll have some in stock from the 1st of October and at a great price!! - We sell 150L bags for less than the price of 100L bags in Garden Centres!!

We are also concerned

that people with Sunday commitments are unable to buy from the shop, so as an experiment the shop will be open on Saturday October 7th, Saturday November 4th and December 2nd at 11 - 12.

Next summer March to June we will return to Saturday and Sunday opening each weekend.
