We have had another busy few months with some interruptions due to bad weather. Hedge cutting has continued with some recent heavier work done on the Old Park Road boundary, more light will get in now and hopefully that hedge will thicken up from the base. If you have a plot



near any boundary, please let us know if anything gives cause for concern. Lots of planting of seedling trees has been done in the past but many of them have been damaged by plot holders climbing over the fence, please don't do this it just encourages others and undoes our hard work. Eventually there will be a pedestrian entrance, but in the meantime please use the gates.

The shady beds have been cleared, weeded and covered with fabric and chippings and re planted, hopefully the weeds won't be as bad in future. We hope to extend the 'stumpery,' do have a look it's very nice at present.

Soil in the bay near the sales container must be used up as quickly as possible. It's good topsoil and can be used to heighten the depth of your plot, shore up any parts near sunken paths or reinstate the channels in the middle of paths. We need the space so that another container can be hired to store more shop stock.

Allotment Shop

Saturday opening has started, so the shop is open Saturday 2-3 and Sunday 11-12 every weekend.

We weigh up 3kg bags of organic and chemical fertilisers some of which are cheaper than the cheapest retail stores.

Blood, Fish & Bone 3kg. Half price.

Bonemeal 3kg 80p cheaper.

Compost maker 1.5kg £2 cheaper.

Strultch is cheaper than garden centres and in bigger bags!!!

We are not just suppliers of compost and manure; we do have a selection of sundries: canes, plant labels, twine, ground cover, ground cover pegs, organic and ordinary slug pellets. If plot holders would like more items, let us know.

We have had to cut down because of a lack of space, but soon will have more space for storage. To buy from the hut means less transport, you are right on the plot!!!

We take cheques, if this makes it easier.

I have had one offer to help in the hut, but if anyone else could volunteer that would be great, we have lost some volunteers.
